1) Who does Psalm 132 initially refer to?

Psalm 132:1,2

2) The sub-title or inscription for this Psalm and others from Psalm 120-134 is "A Song of degrees." What does this mean, and how does this apply to our lesson?"

3) How does the dedication of the temple of God tie into our study? See Psalm 122:1; R4297-"The dedication services described."

4) Please read and review Psalm 132:2-8, and relate the words "How he sware unto the LORD," "Surely I will not come," "I will not give sleep," "Until I find a place for the LORD," "Lo we have heard it from Ephratah," "Arise O LORD into thy rest." from these verses to our lesson.

5) After David was anointed king over Israel, what promise did the LORD make to him?

2 Samuel 5:1-3; 2 Samuel 7:11-16 Hint-Became known as the "sure mercies of David." Psalm 89:3,4

6) What does the anointing oil represent to the true believer in its use and manner of application?

See John 1:32, 3:34; Acts 10:38; Psalm 2:2,7; Acts 2:27,33; Eph. 1:13, 2:18, 4:16; Titus 3:5,6

7) As living stones of the spiritual temple the members require much chiseling and polishing to prepare them for a place in that temple.
