## Psalm 146 - Praise

## "Praise the LORD, O my soul"

In the margin for Psa. 146:1, another word for, "Praise the LORD", is, 'Hallelujah.' The Westminster Bible Dictionary says that the word, 'Hallelujah', is a compound word for the phrase, "Praise ye the LORD." There are **16 Psalms** that are classified the same way. Therefore, we will consider *some* of the **many** reasons why we should Praise our Father in heaven, Jehovah.

- a) In verse 1 Why did the Psalmist say, "Praise the LORD, Oh my soul"?

- 6. In verses 7, 8 and 9 When will these promises be a reality, and for whom? Isa. 35:1-10; 1 Cor. 15:21-26; Rev. 21:1-6; Ps. 145:20
- 7. In verse 10 What is implied in the statement, "The LORD reigns forever"? (NIV) Ps. 41:13; 1 Cor. 15:28; Eph. 2:7; Eph. 3:11; Heb.13:8.
