Verses 1 — 3 – “The Faith Once Delivered To The Saints”

1. What constitutes “the faith that was once for all delivered to the saints [ESV]”?
 - a. Is that faith still the same today as it was then?
 - b. What are proper and improper ways to contend for “the faith”?

Verses 4 — 19 – “Words Of Caution Regarding False Brethren”

2. In what sense were “certain people” ordained long ago to condemnation? (vss. 5,6,7)
 - a. How did they pervert the Grace of God into sensuality?
 - b. How did they deny our Lord and Master Jesus Christ?
 - c. What parallel Scriptures describe this class?
3. How did Joshua save “a people” out of the land of Egypt and when did he destroy the unbelievers? What does this example teach us?
4. Verses 6 – 10 speak of angels who “kept not their first estate,” Sodom and Gomorrah, and the noble archangel Michael. What lesson is Jude emphasizing in using these comparisons?
5. Verses 11 – 13 give further denunciations of the false brethren. Please explain how they are like:
 - a. Cain
 - b. Balaam
 - c. Korah
 - d. Hidden reefs at love feasts
 - e. Shepherds feeding themselves
 - f. Waterless clouds
 - g. Fruitless trees in late autumn
 - h. Twice dead
 - i. Uprooted
 - j. Wild waves of the sea
 - k. Wandering stars
6. In verses 14 and 15, what is the penalty enacted upon these false ones and when will it be meted out?
7. Verses 16 – 19 speak of the grumbling malcontents in the “last times spoken of by the apostles.” According to verse 19, what are their 3 major flaws?
8. Are such false brethren among us today?

Verses 20 – 25 – “Godly Brethren Must Remain Steadfast”

9. What are the two major admonitions Jude offers to help keep ourselves in the love of God. Why are they so invaluable?
10. Regarding our dealings within the brotherhood:
 - a. Who may be the ones who “doubt” and how do we show them mercy?
 - b. Who are those that we may snatch out of the fire and how do we perform that favor?
 - c. Who are those whose garments are stained by the flesh and how do we show mercy accompanied by fear?
11. How does our Heavenly Father keep us from stumbling, to present us blameless before Him?
