	important for Jesus to do this before answering the questions the disciples asked in verse 3
	concerning his return and the end of the age? [Note Jesus' use of the word "end" in vss. 6, 13, & 14
	and "beginning of sorrows" in vs. 8] Mark 13:7,8,13; Luke 21:9; Dan. 12:8-9; II Thess. 2:1-3

Questions 2-4 deal with experiences related to three groups which have taken place during the Gospel Age.

- 2) Group 1, the World: What did Jesus indicate would be the prevailing conditions in the world during the Gospel Age? Matt. 24:6,7; Mark 13:7,8; Luke 21:9-11
- 3) Group 2, the Consecrated: What kinds of experiences did Jesus prophesy would come upon the consecrated during this same period of time, and how were they to react to these? Matt. 24:4,9,10,13; Mark 13:5,9,11-13; Luke 21:12-19; Matt. 10:17-22; John 15:18-20; Il Tim. 3:12
- 4) Group 3, Nominal Spiritual Israel: Do any of the verses of our lesson provide an implication of a future evil system which would "deceive many?" Explain. Matt. 24:5,11,12; Mark 13:6; Luke 21:8; Matt. 24:24; Il Cor. 11:13-15; Il Thess. 2:3-12; Il Pet. 2:1; I John 4:1-3
- 5) Has the preaching of the "gospel of the kingdom" in all the world been for the purpose of converting the world at the present time? Explain. Matt. 24:14; Mark 13:10; Luke 21:13 (note CEV, ESV, Phillips, NASB translations); Matt. 28:18-20; Luke 24:46,47; John 15:26,27; Acts 1:8
