### [Antitypical Passover – Jesus as represented by the cup]

1. In review we recall that the blood of the Passover lamb was sprinkled on the door posts and lintels of the homes. Explain the antitypical significance of this. *Heb. 10:22; John 1:29; John 19:28-30; Deut.6:4-9; Rom. 2:29; Volume 6, page 463 par. 1*
  
2. From 1 Corinthians 11:25, we are told that Jesus takes the cup and says “this cup is the new covenant in my blood” (NASV). Please discuss the points below as they primarily apply to our Lord Jesus.
