We are told in 1 Kings 4:29-34, that God gave Solomon wisdom as great as the sands on the seashore and greater than Egypt and the countries of the East. Further, we are told that he wrote 3,000 proverbs and that Kings from all the nations came to hear his wisdom. As we believe that this wisdom is from above and these Proverbs have found their way into the holy text they deserve to be examined, studied, and used to overcome the carnal mind of the old man and look to the wisdom from above.
