Verses 1-2

1) What is Paul telling the Corinthian brethren about their viewpoint of him when he is "present" with them versus when he is "absent?" What lesson is he trying to impart?

Rom. 15:15; I Cor. 4:19-21; II Cor. 11:21; II Cor. 13:2-4

Verses 3-6

2) What is meant by the statement that though we walk in the flesh, we do not war after the flesh? What are some examples of "carnal" weapons which we should avoid using?

Rom. 8:13; I Tim. 1:18; II Tim. 2:3-4; I Pet. 4:1-2; Eph. 4:31; Col. 3:8-9; I Pet. 2:1

- 3) Paraphrasing the King James wording of verses 4-5, what is meant by weapons which:
 - a. Are mighty through God // Cor. 3:5; // Cor. 4:7; Eph. 6:10-18
 - **b.** Pull down strongholds Josh. 6:20; Jer. 1:9-10
 - c. Cast down imaginations Gen. 6:5; Luke 1:51; Acts 4:25-26; Rom. 1:20-21
 - d. Cast down high things that exalt themselves against God Isa. 2:11-12; Isa. 60:14; Phil. 3:7-9
 - e. Bring every thought into the obedience of Christ Rom. 7:22-25; Heb. 4:12; I Pet. 1:13-15
- 4) Verse 6 is worded quite strongly. In contrast to Paul's authority as a chosen Apostle to make such a bold statement, since none of the Lords' people today have apostolic authority, how careful must we be concerning the matter of avenging disobedience?
